Workshop #1

Thursday, July 15, 2010 Introduction to Nosework 9am-4pm

In this one-day introductory workshop, we concentrate on the basic concepts and foundation skills for dogs and handlers. A PowerPoint presentation covers basics to competition and the development of the National Association of Canine Scent Work. The 6-hour indoor session is limited to 12 working spots but is open to auditors as well. *This workshop is appropriate for all dogs over six months, including those who are shy or reactive, because each team works one at a time while all other dogs are resting in their crates.*

Workshop #2

Friday, July 16, 2010 Introduction to Odor 9am-12pm

In this 3-hour workshop, we introduce the dogs to odor and build on the skills previously learned in the first seminar. This is limited to 12 working spots. (**Prerequisite:** Working spots are only available to handlers who have attended Intro to Nose Work workshops previously or have at least six weeks of practice prior to this workshop.)

Seminar Fees:

Workshop #1: \$175 for working spot, \$75 for auditing spot. Snacks, Lunch and water included.

Workshop #2: \$75 for working spot, \$35 for auditing spot. Snacks and water included.

Ron Gaunt, Master Trainer, National Association of Canine Scent Work

Ron Gaunt, is a retired police officer, professional detection dog trainer with more than 40 years experience who has won many awards in police K9 trials & private sport. He has certified over 20 dogs in narcotics and explosives. His background includes training for cadaver, tracking, SAR, SWAT, scout & interdiction work. He owns a private detection company in southern California since 1995 and is co-founder of the sport of K9 Nose Work and the National Association of Canine Scent Work.

Amy Herot is a professional detection handler and trainer and has logged over 1500 instructional hours in Narcotics Detection training. She has trained and certified teams in Narcotics and Explosives for the private sector and law enforcement. She has competed locally and nationally in Narcotics and Bomb Detection events with her dogs, Maya and Seven. As co-founder of K9 Noseworks and the National Association of Canine Scent Work (NACSW), she brings that experience to companion dogs and handlers through the development of nose work classes and sport events. Odor Recognition Test (Birch)

Trial entry requires that handler/dog teams must have passed the appropriate Odor Recognition Test (ORT) in advance of the trial. The purpose of the ORT is to verify that the dogs know the target odor (scent) used in competition. Successful passage of an ORT requires a dog to identify the location of the target odor and the handler to correctly call an 'alert' (or equivalent) within a three-minute time period.
